## Program Cost Sheet 2025 Master of Arts in Education Alternative Route to Certification – Elementary



The MAE Alternative Routes with Elementary Certification requires 34 semester credits for completion. Students can choose to complete both the certification and the degree requirements, or complete the certification portion only.

- The certification portion is 26 semester credits from summer 2025 to spring 2026.
- After completion of the certificate portion, students have 3 years (by spring 2028) to complete the remaining 8 credits required for the MAE degree.

Tuition is based on a cohort model. Students must complete the program with their cohort to remain eligible for cohort pricing.

Total tuition for certification program (26 credits): \$25,246 (\$971 per credit)

Total tuition for certification with the MAE degree (34 credits): \$33,014 (\$971 per credit)

Additional fees include: technology fee (\$270/year), wellness fee (\$110/year), a one-time matriculation fee (\$205), books and materials for coursework, certification, fingerprinting, etc. (Subject to change)
