COURSE OVERVIEW

This course will apply a scientific and historic perspective to explore the classic ideas of "good" and "evil." We will read and discuss literature from the scientific field of Moral Psychology-which integrates ideas from evolutionary anthropology, philosophy, developmental and cognitive psychologyand we will explore the rich history of Bavaria, including the rise of Nazism and crimes perpetrated in the Holocaust. We will use interdisciplinary behavioral research to gain a better understanding of concepts such as altruism, authoritarianism, bigotry, genocide, and power, and relate these concepts to fundamental human needs such as belonging, cognition, status, and understanding.

Why should we study Psychology in Germany?

Bavaria has a uniquely rich history and culture but also was the seat of the rise of Nazism. This contrasting history provides an ideal location for the exploration of the dual-nature of morality and demonstrates the complexities of human moral systems. It also provides a wonderful opportunity to address multiple frameworks for understanding the influence of culture and for cultivating respect for diverse cultures, practices, and traditions.
