PLU Wild Hope Center for Vocation 2025 - Student Voices on Vocation Contest Proposal Form and Project Prompt

The Wild Hope Center for Vocation invites all currently enrolled full-time undergraduate students to **submit a proposal** for our *2025 Student Voices on Vocation Contest*. Proposals will be reviewed by faculty and staff from the Center for Vocation Advisory Committee.

Students whose proposals are selected by our committee and who complete their proposed projects by May 1, will receive a \$150 prize and will be honored at the Wild Hope Banquet including a catered dinner on May 7th. Winners will be notified via PLU email and announced on the Center's social media. As many as 8 winners will be chosen.

This year, we challenge students to **explore the theme of sustainability and ecological flourishing** and express how your sense of vocation (meaning, purpose, or calling) shapes and inspires you to engage with these critical issues.

Through an essay, video, poem, artwork, or another creative format, you are invited to reflect on how your undergraduate educational experience has influenced or is influencing your understanding of sustainability and ecological flourishing, and how you are called to promote these values in your life, community, and world.

Proposal Options and Submission Guidelines

Students may submit proposals for a project in one of the following formats:

- How has PLU's commitment to sustainability shaped your understanding of local partnerships and actions that support ecological health?
- In what ways do the values of thoughtful inquiry, service, leadership, and care connect with local and global efforts to promote ecological flourishing?
- How have your academic OR co-curricular experiences at PLU equipped you to participate in sustainability initiatives within your community?
